Project Goals and Objectives are...

- Form an Internet-based network of professionals from the Czech District Hygiene Stations (DIT's) & NGO's
- Train & Enhance Capacity of these organizations and individuals
- Establish a new NGO for cardiovascular disease prevention and tobacco control advocacy

A Czech Tobacco-Control Training and Communications Demonstration Program is being established at IKEM. Health professionals from the DIT's and other tobacco-control professionals and NGO's will learn to apply contemporary information technology for public policy advocacy and tobacco control.

The project's international partners include: UICC-GLOBA*Link* of Geneva—for training in internet and tobacco control communications; Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids and the Advocacy Institute, both in Washington, D.C—for training in advocacy and policy reform; and the American Heart Association in Dallas--for training in grass roots action.

In addition to creating an electronic network of Czech health professionals and NGOs, the project will ultimately lead to the establishment of a Czech Heart Association — the first grassroots membership organization dedicated

to smoking and cardiovascular disease prevention. This association will be patterned after and assisted by the American Heart Association, one of the oldest NGO's engaged in health promotion and tobacco control in the United States.

The experience in the Czech Republic will be evaluated for wide scale applicability in the CEE-NIS region and elsewhere.

Current & Upcoming Events...

- Internet Training Workshop at NIPH: DIT's, NGO's and other professionals convened at a workshop in Prague in October 1999 for training in using the Internet-- with all its infrastructure and resources--and the role of communication in health promotion and tobacco control networking in the Czech Republic.
- *UICC-Globalink's Czech List-Serve*: Project partner UICC-GLOBA*Link* of Geneva has initiated a special Czech List-serve and will soon host the project's website and bulletin board.
- **Tobacco Control Communications Center at IKEM:** The center will serve as a hub for further training in communications, tobacco control, and grass roots advocacy.
- WHO Healthy Cities Link-Up: WHO's Healthy Cities will link up with the project at a joint press conference in January 2000, just in time for the Czech Parliament's new legislation to address concerns about increased youth smoking.
- Media Advocacy Workshop: Aimed at enhancing skills and coverage of tobacco issues, this media workshop in April 2000 will serve as a forum for exchange between health professionals and journalists from radio, television and print media on enhanced, accurate media coverage. US-based Centers for Disease Control and Prevebtion and Campaign For Tobacco-Free Kids may participate.
- *International "Quit & Win" Campaign*: Project will participate in the reknowned International "Quit & Win 2000" campaign in May 2000.
- *Policy Reform Workshop*: A June 2000 workshop on training in policy advocacy may include US-based Advocacy Institute and the Campaign For Tobacco-Free Kids.
- 11th World Conference on Tobacco or Health: Partners will visit Chicago for this landmark conference in August 2000.
- **Tobacco-Control Conference:** A tobacco-control conference in Fall 2000 will bring together Czech DIT's, NGO's and international authorities, especially the american Heart Association to form a Czech NGO devoted to control of cardiovascular disease, with tobacco control as its central theme.

- A self-sustaining Tobacco-Control Training and Communications Program with excellence in communications technology, and regional, national and international linkage and outreach.
- A demand-based Internet resource service on tobacco control issues.
- A comprehensive data collection system to support program operations.
- Pre- and post-surveys of knowledge, skills and applications among trainees to assess program impact.
- Continuous electronic-media tobacco-control campaigns to engage more segments of Czech society in tobacco control.
- A WWW web site with an electronic bulletin board, resource directory, What's New listing.
- Monthly electronic bulletins with nationwide and international circulation
- A non-govenment Czech Heart Association

This newly formed Czech Heart Association will be introduced to effective application of communications technology, exposed to international, sustainable models such as the

the American Heart Association and the American Cancer Society, specializing in public health, especially tobacco control.

The Czech, American and European partners are working together to make this model program a reality for the Czech Republic and to apply the lessons learned to address the need for tobacco control throughout the world.
