What a difference a generation can make. From 1975 to 2000 the number of democracies more than doubled across the globe — until today there are 117 electoral democracies, representing over 61 percent of the world's countries and nearly 55% of its population.

From Portugal and Spain to Poland and Russia, from Chile to South Africa and on to Indonesia, this non-violent democratic revolution was largely unpredicted and it is still gathering steam. Today the majority of the world's Muslims live in electoral democracies; Iran's people in the face of determined and sometimes violent opposition have demonstrated at the ballot box the universal desire for popular participation in governance. Taiwan has demonstrated that democracy can thrive in a Chinese culture.




